The Program

The Parent-Child Mother Goose program promotes parent-child relationships through the fun of oral language experiences.

The program embraces families from all backgrounds providing a valuable resource to first time parents and experienced parents alike.

Children gain communication and social skills. As parents, you will gain confidence, further develop your parenting skills and strengthen your parent-child relationship.

What happens?

- The group begins with an informal welcome, chat and play.
- Then follows a rhyme and song session, including a story.
- Morning tea encourages you to build relationships with other parents and share experiences while your children play.



Teaching is aimed at parents with children joining in according to their individual stage of development.

As parents, you will learn rhymes, songs and stories which can then be used at home, integrated into your daily routine.

These rhymes, songs and stories nurture your child's listening and spoken language development.

The mutual enjoyment nourishes the bond between you and your child.

We encourage and welcome families with a child who has additional needs.
